The Bucks County Performing Arts Center is proud to partner with the new Yardley-Makefield Chamber Music Society to present a series of three free concerts this summer. These concerts will be held at 4:00 P.M. in the Yardley Community Centre on the last Saturday's of June, July, and August. Refreshments will be provided as well as informative discussion about the music to be played. All performers are donating their time and talent for these community events.

The first concert on June 27 will be a "Mostly Mozart" affair and will include violin/piano duos, a piano trio, and a piano quartet. Performers from the local area will be joined by faculty artists from Westminster Conservatory and the Settlement School of Music in Philadelphia. On July 25, 19<sup>th</sup> and 20<sup>th</sup> century music for flute, viola, and piano will be featured in works by English, French, and American composers. Lower Makefield residents Susan Spevak (flute), Martin Stepper (piano), and guest artist Marka Kasker-Simmons (viola) will perform this varied program. The final concert on August 29 will feature international artist Amy JiaQi Yang in a program of major solo piano works. Ms. Yang is a 2006 graduate of the prestigious Curtis Institute of Music in Philadelphia and has also studied at Juilliard and Yale. She has played with many well-known artists such as David Soyer, Arnold Steinhardt, Ida and Ani Kavafian, and Miriam Fried. Hailed by Harris Goldsmith of *The New York Concert Review* as "*a magnificent artist and poet: everything she touches turns to gold--a Midas touch for tone and music*", the twenty-four-year-old pianist has captured first prizes at many competitions and has performed in various renowned venues in the United States, Europe and Asia.

All are invited to attend these free concerts in a relaxed atmosphere during a less stressful time of year.
